INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this BMGA League Guide is to provide a resource for all BMGA members concerning questions surrounding the Wednesday Night League and Weekend Tournaments. It is not meant to be an all-inclusive reference source, so if you ever have any additional questions or if you feel this guide can be improved, please contact your BMGA Board Members.

The BMGA is made up of two primary components -- the Wednesday Night League (WNL) and Weekend Tournaments/Events. Much of the information is common across both components. This guide will describe the common components and dive into more detail on each. In addition, the BMGA League Guide will provide updated information on the current BMGA Board of Directors and will highlight Weekend Tournaments.

The BMGA is a competitive social golf league. All members must adhere by USGA Rules during play. All members play from the Member Tees or Gold Tees - if they qualify. Additionally, all members play with a maximum handicap of 36 for 18 holes or 18 for 9 holes.

Common Components

HANDICAP

- The BMGA requires each member to maintain a handicap in accordance with USGA guidelines. Members must purchase their handicap service at Brookview Golf Course each season. The BMGA has been using the World Handicap System (WHS) since the 2020 season.
- If a player keeps a handicap at more than one course, the player must purchase handicap services at the various courses and apply for a refund via the Minnesota Golf Association (MGA). The refund form can be found at the Brookview Pro Shop.
- If a Member does not have an “Official Handicap” at the start of the season, the Member will be required to play at least 54 holes of golf (six “9 Hole Rounds” or three “18 Hole Rounds” or combination thereof) and have the rounds entered into the handicap system.
- The BMGA follows the WHS net double bogey rule, which is the maximum score one can post for any given hole. It is calculated as (Par + 2) plus any handicap strokes a golfer receives on that hole. For example, if the hole is a par 4, then double bogey = 6, and if one’s handicap gives them a stroke on that hole, then the net double bogey is a 7. The reasons for this rule are to reduce the impact of a bad score on one’s handicap index.
- After every round of a non BMGA sanctioned event, the members of the BMGA must enter their scores into the “WHS Handicap System” either at Brookview (Brookview maintains a computer for all golfers to enter rounds into outside of the Pro-Shop) or wherever they have played their round. The BMGA will post all WNL and Weekend Tournament rounds. Additionally, BMGA members may submit their scores via www.GHIN.com or the GHIN app.
- It is important that everyone be conscientious in entering their scores into the handicap system regularly, accurately, and punctually. Players who are not current with entering their scores into the WHS system may not be eligible for prizes until they have entered all absent scores.
- The Handicap Computer is in the hallway just outside the Pro Shop. Pro Shop and Administration staff will be glad to assist you with any questions you have on entering your scores. Handicap cards can be created and updated by using this system. Handicaps are updated daily.
- Starting in 2020, BMGA Board policy requires that a maximum handicap index of 36.0 under the WHS be maintained for 18 Holes of golf, with a maximum handicap of 18.0 for 9 Holes in the WNL.

BMGA WEB SITE

- Weekly WNL and Weekend Tournament updates will be posted on the official BMGA Web Site www.BMGA.org. By logging into the website, you will have additional features available to you.

YEAR END BANQUET

- The golf year is topped off with a special banquet where BMGA Members can bring their spouse or significant other. Please visit the BMGA website for date and times.

HOLE-IN-ONE CLUB

- \$5 per member per season will be allocated to a Hole-in-One Fund (part of your dues, not additional).
- If a Hole-in-One is attained either during WNL or a Weekend Tournament, the person shooting the Hole-in-One will receive a cash prize for the amount in the Hole-in-One Fund at that time.
- Payout will occur at the end of the year banquet.
- If a season has multiple Hole-in-One's, the payout will be divided equally amongst winners on a pro rata basis based upon the number of Hole-in-One's obtained by each player (e.g., if one player obtains two Hole-in-Ones and another player has one Hole-in-One, the Hole-in-One fund will be divided on a 2/3 by 1/3 basis)
- If there are no Hole-in-Ones, funds carry over to the following year and the pot will continue to grow until a BMGA league member obtains a Hole-in-One.
- Past due league fees are to be withheld from payouts.
- To be eligible to win money in the Hole-in-One club, the Hole-in-One must be made during:
 - Wednesday evening league normal play, including Substitutes and Fill-Ins
 - All Weekend events
 - Exclusions are for the Single-Man Match Play and the Two-Man Match Play after the opening rounds of each event, and
 - Exclusions also apply to Guest Day (if held) and the Par 3 Social (if held)

FEES

- BMGA Dues + WNL Fees:\$500
- Brookview Club Membership and USGA Handicap Fee must be purchased at the Brookview Pro Shop.:

- All returned check fees charged to the BMGA will be charged to the member whose check was returned.

PACE OF PLAY

- Golfers should aim to complete 9 holes of golf in 2 hours. Avoid behaviors that slow the pace of play. For example, one should forego "honors" and play ready golf. Every golfer should be ready to hit their next shot without delay. Although golfers are expected to finish putting out, in match play it is acceptable to give the putt to your opponent if it is probable they will sink it. If the group is behind, once one has holed out, it is acceptable to proceed to the next tee box and tee off.

LOCAL RULES

- The BMGA has several local rules designed to speed up play and to help with situations that are unique to Brookview. This guide does not list these rules. Please see the Local Rules information at www.BMGA.org/bmga-local-rules.

TRAVELING TEAMS

- The BMGA has two traveling teams that play scratch golf against teams from other courses in the Twin Cities and surrounding areas. A fully handicapped Metro Seniors League is also available at Brookview.

12-Man Team:

- The 16-man team plays five matches with divisional teams either at Brookview or at opponents' courses before the playoffs. The format of play is similar to the Ryder Cup: two players from each team play a non-handicapped 4-ball match for 3 total points: 1 point for the front nine, 1 point for the back nine, and 1 point for overall. The team with the most points wins the match.

8-Man Senior Team:

- The 8-Man Senior traveling team is available only to seniors (age 55+ during the year of competition) and plays matches similar in format to the 16-Man Team.
- Players must be an amateur, a member of the MPGA member club they are representing and have a Handicap Index for the current season. Note: all players must play from the same tees.

Metro Seniors League:

- Brookview has two teams in the fully handicapped Metro Seniors League and competes with other courses in the metro. Any BMGA member with a current handicap and who is over 50 can participate. The rounds are on Friday mornings at area courses. For each team, Brookview sends 4 players per round (A, B, C, D). For more information, check out the league website at <http://www.metroseiors.org>.

See the Committee and Teams Section for current captains of each of these teams.

Wednesday Night League

Structure

The regular season schedule consists of 18 weeks followed by 3 weeks of playoffs. The League is composed of 192 golfers – 16 teams of 12 golfers per team. The BMGA Board annually sets the registration dates for the league.

Requirements

To play in the WNL a golfer must:

- Be a member of the BMGA, with fully paid dues before the start of the season.
- Purchase a Club Member Card from the Brookview Golf Course.
- Purchase an MGA Association Membership which includes WHS handicap, available through the Brookview Golf Course.
- Be 18 years of age or older by April 1st of the current year.

Selection Policy

Selection policy: If the number of golfers interested in joining the WNL exceeds the maximum allowed, then selection will be made in the following manner:

1. WNL Members in good standing from the previous year, including those on medical leave.
2. Members from Weekend Only League from the previous year.
3. General public and Golden Valley residents

In the event more applications than spots available for #1 or #2, priority will be given to those with most years seniority. If the individuals have the same years of service, the date of their application will be used. Selection for priority #3 is based solely on date and time of application.

WNL Rules

The various elements of WNL structure will be broken down and explained as follows: Pairings; Late/Absent Player; and Scoring. **WNL is played from the Member Tees (or Gold Tees if eligible, see Gold Tee Guidelines below) and is a Match Play Event.**

Pairings: Each week, two members from a WNL Team will be scheduled to play at a specified tee time against two players from a different WNL Team. While each foursome includes two players from one team, and two from another, all matches are individual. IT IS IMPORTANT TO ESTABLISH WHICH PLAYERS ARE PLAYING EACH OTHER BEFORE THE MATCH BEGINS.

It is up to the discretion of the group to determine the matches. However, if not otherwise agreed to, the default basis for determining matches is handicaps, where the lower handicapped player from the first team plays the lower handicapped player from the second team.

Substitution Rules:

If a team member is not on the tee box at their scheduled tee time, they are **late**. Another member of the same team may **substitute** for the late player and compete in the match and side games without penalty or scoring adjustment.

If a substitute is not available, the starter may allow any WNL member to “fill in” for the late player. The fill in player may compete in on course contests and side games, but their score will not factor into the Match.

If at the last minute the late player arrives after his group has teed off but before the next group has hit a shot, they may hit their tee shot and replace the substitute or fill-in player. However, once any player in the following tee time has hit their tee shot, the late player is considered **absent** and may not replace a substitute or fill-in player in his

scheduled tee time. The absent player is eligible to substitute for a member of his team at a later tee time.

A player may only play once each week (i.e. a player is not allowed to loop and play in two different tee times).

Weekend Play Subs for WNL: In the event a captain is unable to get 8 players for their team during regular season play, a captain can reach out to any weekend player who is in good standing and have them sub for their team and earn regular points. A captain may only use a weekend player sub for WNL a maximum of three times during the regular season. A sub cannot be used for position play or playoffs.

Scoring: There are a total of ten (10) points awarded in each match. Nine (9) points for the match (1 point per hole) and 1 Bonus Point for the person with the most Match Points. Holes and the Bonus Point can be split in the case of a tie.

- 1 point is awarded on each hole to the player with the lower net score. In case of a tie on a hole, ½ point is awarded to each player. Handicaps for nine holes are determined by the appropriate table located in the end of this document (and available on tees #1 and #10) or by looking up Course Handicaps on GHIN using the appropriate tees. **The maximum handicap for nine holes is 18.**
- Subtract the lower player's handicap from the players with the handicap to determine where handicap strokes should be allocated.
- In case of an Absent Player, the present player who was supposed to play the absent player will play the card to determine the points for the match. A net par or better is considered to win the hole. A net bogey will be considered a tie. A net double-bogey or worse is considered losing the hole. The present player will automatically win the Bonus Point. The present player will receive a minimum of 4 points, regardless of how they score.
- The maximum score on a hole for WNL is quad bogey (gross) and loses the hole. Players should pick up when they reach a quad bogey. In the event BOTH players reach a max score of quad-bogey the points will be assigned as follows:
 - If both players are on the green, the hole is halved.
 - If one is on the green and the other not, the player on the green wins, regardless of distance.
 - If both are off the green, the hole is halved.

WNL STRUCTURE

- The WNL consists of 15 weeks of regular season WNL play, followed by 3 weeks of position play and 3 weeks of playoffs.
- 8 teams make the playoffs. The top 4 teams after the 15-week regular season based on points qualifies to the playoffs. The top 4 remaining teams after the three position weeks also makes the playoffs. A total of 8 teams makes the playoffs.
- Weeks 1 to 15, each team will play every team once.
- Weeks 16, 17 and 18 are position weeks.
 - Seeds 1 to 4 are locked into the playoffs and will play each other once during the position weeks.
 - Seed #5 plays Seed #6, Seed #7 plays Seed #8, Seed #9 plays Seed #10, etc.
 - Repeat the above for all three position weeks for seeds 5 to 16.
- Points earned during the first 15 weeks are added to the points earned during the position weeks.

WNL DRAFT

Each year teams will be able to protect up to 7 players from the previous year's 12 player team. This means Team Captains may have to cut up to five players to get down to the maximum of 7 players ("Keepers"). The players being retained, and the players being cut, must be reported to the WNL Director by the date specified before the annual WNL Draft. The Team Captain is included among the 7 players that may be kept. **All unprotected Returning Members, including any members that were on "Injured Reserve" the previous year,** and New Members will be placed into the Draft Pool.

Draft Order

- The team that won the WNL championship match will have the last pick.
- The team that lost in the WNL championship match, will have the second to last pick
- The team that lost in the semi-finals (round 2), with the most regular season points, will pick third to last
- The team that lost in the semi-finals (round 2), with the least regular season points, will pick fourth to last
- The team that lost in round 1, with the most regular season points, will pick fifth to last
- The team that lost in round 1, with the second most regular season points, will pick sixth to last
- The team that lost in round 1, with the third most regular season points, will pick seventh to last
- The team that lost in round 1, with the least regular season points, will pick eighth to last
- All non-playoff teams will pick from pick #1 to pick #8 with the team with the fewest number of points in the regular season picking first, the team with the second fewest points, picking second, etc.
- The draft order is not serpentine.

The draft will take place in the order listed below in priority.

Priority #1 – Regular Draft for 1st and 2nd Round

- Based on the draft order established above, each team will select their first-round draft pick.
- Based on the draft order established, each team will select their second-round draft pick.

Priority #2 – Supplemental Rounds

- Any team that has fewer than 9 players, after rounds 1 and 2, will automatically enter the supplemental draft.
- The team with the fewest players, picks first in the supplemental draft. If more than one team has the same number of players, the team, using the draft order established above, will choose first.
- This process will repeat until all teams have 9 players.

Priority #3 – Regular Draft for 3rd, 4th, and 5th rounds.

- Based on the draft order established, each team will select their third, fourth and fifth round picks.

WNL PLAYOFF RULES

The Playoffs will consist of 8 teams which are determined and seeded as follows:

- Total points after 18 weeks of play. The top 4 teams after the regular season will be seeded 1 to 4 based on total points. The remaining 4 teams are seeded based on their final points after the position weeks.
- Ties will be broken first head-to-head points in any weeks they matched against each other – in a two-way tie. If there are three or more-way tie, use next tie breaker.
- The total points in the team's best 10 weeks of play, regardless of which week it happened.
- The total points in the team's best 9 weeks of play, regardless of which week it happened.
- Continue to eliminate one week of play until there are no ties.

The playoffs will consist of 3 rounds.

- Round One (Quarterfinals) matches will be will be the #1 vs #8 seed, #2 vs #7 seed, #3 vs #6 seed, #4 vs #5 seed.
- Round Two (Semifinals) will be the winner of matches in Round One in bracket.
- Round Three (Finals) will be the two winners of Round Two, with the winner being named the WNL Champions.

WNL PLAYOFF INDIVIDUAL PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

- To be eligible to participate in the WNL playoffs, a BMGA member must have played in at least four weeks during the WNL season or have been on a team's active roster on or before week 12 of WNL league play. Individuals added to a team roster after week 12 are not eligible to participate in the WNL playoffs.
- Captains will pick 8 players to play in these championship matches and assign the matches to be played and at what time. Once the matches are assigned, Captains will not be allowed to modify matches except to substitute for missing players on the match day.
 - Captains are to work with their opponent Captain to schedule the matches. There is strategy involved, so choose carefully.
 - Captains can have 'subs' standing by. Captains will be allowed to put subs in for 'missing' players on the match day.
 - Lists of those playing are to be furnished to Brookview and the WNL Director by the Tuesday before the match.
- No shows will lose all 10 points. There will be no "Blind Draw" for these matches.
- All team members of the winning teams will win prizes, not just the golfers playing.
- The format will be the same as the WNL format (9 points for a Match and 1 bonus point for the Match Total). The Team accumulating the most points will win.

TIE BREAKING RULES: During Playoffs

- Before the matches start, the Captains will give the WNL Director a list of who their 3 "Tie Breaker" matches are for that playoff round.
- The total points of the three tie breaker matches will be used to break a tie. In case of a continuing tie, a flip of the coin will determine the winner.
- Another option, if both Captains agree, is to set up another two matches (one more tee time) to only be used if the previous matches tie. Teams will still need to provide 3 tie-breaker matches in case this additional match results in a tie. Or have some type of sudden death tie breaker where the outcome is determined on the course vs. the current methodology. Both captains must agree, in writing with the WNL coordinator, prior to round starting or the above system will be used.

PLAYOFF WEEKS

- Tee Times for the playoffs will be set up by the WNL Director prior to the end of the regular season.
- There will be no on course games during the playoff weeks.
- During the first round, there will be some open tee times available for playoff qualifiers who are not scheduled to play, including those players on teams that are on bye.
- Team Captains of the playoff teams must release to the WNL Director unused tee times so that they may be used by non-playoff team members by Monday at noon prior to the first round of playoffs.
- There will be a limited number of tee times for non-playoff team members, sign-ups will be communicated by the WNL Director.
- No extra tee times will be available for any players during the WNL Semifinals and Finals.

HANDICAP

- Failure to have an "Official Handicap" by the 5th week will require the member to play as a scratch (0 handicap).
- Members without official WHS handicaps during the first 4 weeks of the season will be assigned a handicap in accordance with the BMGA Modified Handicap System per the model in this League Guide. The BMGA Modified handicap for that night is based on that evening's score that a player shoots. For additional guidance refer to table labeled Modified BMGA Handicap System (next page).
- All WNL members must enter their Wednesday night scores as soon as possible. Failure to enter scores in a timely fashion may create a forfeiture of points accumulated for their WNL team.

MODIFIED BMGA HANDICAP SYSTEM

- This handicap system is used for BMGA members who do not have an official WHS handicap. This Modified BMGA Handicap is for use only during the first four weeks of the WNL. Failure to have an “Official WHS Handicap” by the fifth week will require the member to play as a scratch golfer.
- **WNL participants must use a 9-hole course handicap calculated as follows:**

IMPORTANT ADJUSTMENT: The following must be accounted for before calculating your Handicap. Maximum Score allowed is DOUBLE BOGEY for any hole. This adjustment is to be made to your score before determining your BMGA Modified Handicap. The WNL maximum handicap for 9 holes is 18.

GOLD TEE GUIDELINES

BMGA members who are 65+ years of age on the day of the match/tournament, are eligible to play from the Gold tees during Wednesday Night League play as well as select BMGA sponsored weekend events as determined by the BMGA Board.

BMGA members who meet the above criteria will be deemed "Gold Tee" eligible.

In addition, all other BMGA members will be afforded the opportunity to play from the Gold tees when opposing a "Gold Tee" eligible member who elects to play from the Gold tees vs. the Member tees. **If the players opt to play the Gold tees, both players' handicaps must be calculated using the Gold tees (not Member tees) for the entire match being played. Once the players have teed off from the Gold tees, neither player may revert back to the Member tees or vice versa.**

Moving up to the Gold tees will be allowed during the following:

1. Wednesday Night League
2. Individual Match Play Tournament
3. Two Person Match Play Tournament (Note: If one or both partners on a two-person team are Gold Tee eligible, and elect to play the Gold tees, an equal number of players from the opposing two-person team may also elect to play the Gold tees.)

BMGA Members, who are not Gold Tee eligible, are not permitted to play from the Gold tees in any other BMGA sponsored weekend event.

PRIZES

- Prizes approved by the BMGA Board will be awarded for: Closest to the Pin on Holes 4, 8, 12, and 17; Closest to the Pin in Two Shots on Holes 1 and 11; and Longest Holed Putt on Holes 9 and 18.
- Also, for every Wednesday of the WNL, there are \$120 in prizes awarded.
 - Net Skins game for both the Front 9 and Back 9 (\$50 per side)
 - If no skins are won on a given side, NET eagles will be paid for that side.
 - Gross Eagle Exception
 - In the event there is a gross eagle vs a net eagle, the gross eagle will be paid out if there is only a single gross eagle.
 - This exception is only for a Gross Eagle vs Net Eagle. If a player has a Gross Birdie / Net Eagle and another player has a Gross Par / Net Eagle. Both players have a Net Eagle, and the skin is cancelled out.
 - Each week one of three sides games will be played. It will rotate between: Low Gross/Low Net, 2-Person Best Ball, 2-Person Both Ball. Winners will be announced weekly.

In the case of ties in the weekly games, the prize is combined and split (i.e., tie for 1st means the prize for 1st and 2nd is combined and split). Final payout will be at the discretion of the WNL Director.

WNL Season Ending Prizes:

- 1st Place seed after regular season will win \$35 for each member of the Team.
- 2nd place seed after regular season will win \$25 for each member of the Team.
- The winning teams in the first round will win \$15 per player of each Team (4 Teams).
- The Semifinal Champions will win \$30 for each member on the Team.
- The WNL Team Champion will win \$35 for each Team member and have their team name and player names

engraved on the WNL Championship Trophy.

- All prizes will be paid out in Brookview Pro Shop merchandise credits.
- Payouts are based on full participation in the WNL. The BMGA Board reserves the right to modify prize payout based on actual membership.
- The WNL Director will not calculate games. The outcomes are computed when scores are entered into the BMGA scoring system. The WNL Director will review the calculations and the winners handicap will be subject to review by the Handicap Committee.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT LEAGUE MOST VALUABLE PLAYER (WNL MVP)

The one player with the most accumulated points during the season will be awarded the league MVP trophy as well as a \$250 gift card to the Brookview Pro Shop. This trophy is on permanent display in the Brookview Trophy Case.

SCORECARDS

The WNL will provide Official League Scorecards that are to be picked up from the Starters. All matches and team points are based on accurate and readable scorecards.

The following rules apply to all players:

- Only the Official Card will be accepted each week. This scorecard will allow for the Match, Match Total, and the Weekly Game.
- It is the policy of the club that at least one golfer from each team must sign the scorecard. Submitted cards not attested to by group can be considered void (at the discretion of the WNL Director). All Players full names must be clearly printed (both first and LAST names).
- Inability to determine who the players are may cause the card to be voided.
- The Players' Team # and Handicap must be clearly identified on the card.
- Scorecards must be turned in each Wednesday before going home. Scorecards not turned in by the time the WNL Director goes home will be voided and not considered for any point totals. The WNL Director will ensure there is a prominent drop location each week.
- UNREADABLE CARDS WILL BE VOIDED BY THE WNL DIRECTOR. The decision to void ineligible score cards is at the discretion of the WNL Director. Please ensure your card is legible.

RAIN-OUTS

- The Management at Brookview Golf Course along with the WNL Director will determine rain-outs.
- To check on a rain-out situation call the league cancellation line, one hour (2:30 PM) before the first tee time: 763-512-2300 Press #2 then #1
- RAIN-OUTS ARE NOT ALWAYS MADE UP. An exception might be if, for example, three rain-outs occur and to ensure value to the members, the BMGA Board would work with the course to extend the season, thus allowing for make ups.
- In the event of a rain-out occurring mid-round, meaning the siren has sounded and half the field has not yet finished the round, the round will be voided. If over half the field has finished the round, the BMGA board will meet to decide how best to address the situation.

PERSONNEL INVOLVED WITH THE WEDNESDAY NIGHT LEAGUE

The BMGA Board establishes the guidelines for running the WNL. The WNL Director is charged with following the guidelines established by the BMGA Board. The WNL Director reports to the BMGA Board of Directors.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT LEAGUE DIRECTOR(S)

The Director(s) will:

- Plan the league year events, games, and prizes for presentation and approval to the BMGA Board of Directors. The BMGA Board will review and approve prior to the start of the WNL season.

- Recruit Captains and coordinate a Draft Meeting Night.
- Set the Teams and Schedule and present to the BMGA Board.
- Provide training to the Captains on properly filling out the score cards.
- Review all scorecards each week for accuracy in the game or event.
- Post the winners of the weekly events by Saturday following the league night.
- Work with Brookview Staff to collect the special event flags.
- Notify the Brookview Management of the members who won prizes.
- Ensure that the beverage night logistics are managed.
- Order the beverages for beverage nights.
- Notify Brookview Golf Course of the winners each week. Brookview management will prepare the electronic records/chits for the winners.

Responsibilities for all members of the WNL are as follows:

WEDNESDAY NIGHT LEAGUE MEMBERS

The Individual WNL members will:

- Show up on-time for their Wednesday Night match. They are to check in with the Brookview Starter at least 10 minutes before their scheduled tee-time to let them know they are ready to start and play their match.
- If they are unable to show up, they should find a replacement (each Team has 4 team members not scheduled to play each week) and they must notify their Team Captain if there is a change. It is extremely important that the team members keep their Captain informed if they are unable to play. The replacement should notify the Brookview Starter of the change when checking in.
- Ensure that the scorecard is clearly written and properly attested. Any card not meeting BMGA requirements will be voided.
- Remember, you are part of a WNL team and your team is counting on you to do your best and enjoy your round.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Team Captains will:

- HAVE AN E-MAIL ADDRESS
- Attend the Team Draft meeting where team members are selected and assigned. After the meeting, Captains will email/call their Team Members to welcome them and gather any schedule preferences and/or conflict information for each person on the WNL team.
- Name the Team.
- Schedule players for the weekly match play tee times. This will be done on a template provided at the Captain's Draft Meeting.
- Schedule the players to play with the other players on the Team. Captains should avoid scheduling two people playing each week together.
- Consider the following variables in the schedule: vacations, work schedules, early and late tee times, 1st and 10th tees, times, equal number of rounds for all team members.
- After completing the schedule, Captains will notify the individuals of their Team name and playing schedule. This should be accomplished using a phone call and/or either mail or e-mail. Each member must know their Team Captain, Team Name, all Team members, and the full schedule.
- Send a copy of their schedule to the WNL Director. The WNL Director will copy Brookview Golf Course Administration once all schedules have been compiled.
- Explain to the Team Members that they will not be playing every week. When not playing they can become subs for a scheduled Team member who cannot play. Only Team members can play for the Team in the scheduled matches.

- Keep informed from their Team members of schedule changes or absences. Captains must ensure that the Team has a full complement of players playing each week. With a full Team each week, the Team has a strong chance of winning prizes.
- Ensure that Team members turn in their scorecards each week. This can be accomplished by calling the Team members before golf night and insuring one of the two persons in the foursome will be responsible for turning in the scorecard.
- Stay knowledgeable of their team's standings and statistics. Results will be posted on the BMGA website (WWW.BMGA.ORG)

HOLES MODIFIED FROM THE MGA RATED COURSE OR NOT PLAYABLE

In the event a hole on the course is modified by the Course Superintendent, the WNL Director will either change the weekly game or modify the weekly game to ensure the game played is balanced for players playing front and back.

An example is: when Hole 14 is being played as a Par 3 from the white tees, and the game is individual low net, the WNL Director will require all players playing the back to add a stroke to their score on Hole 14, thus balancing the total strokes played by all.

SLOW PLAY

Slow play is not tolerated by the WNL. Ready golf is not only encouraged but required. Every person should be ready to hit their next shot and should play without delay. All players are asked to hit when ready and forgo any 'Honors'. When putting, all players are asked to finish putting out, if possible. In match play, it is acceptable to 'Give' the putt to your opponent if it is probable the opponent will sink it. When on the tee box – hit when ready. If behind, it is acceptable to proceed to the next tee box and tee off as soon as you have holed out.

Weekend Events

INTRODUCTION

In addition to participating in the WNL, all BMGA members are invited and encouraged to participate in weekend golf tournaments.

- Be a member in good standing of the BMGA
- (i.e., as a minimum, have dues fully paid prior to the start of the BMGA's season)
- Have purchased an Adult Brookview Golf Course Club Member Card, available through Brookview Golf Course.
- Have a WHS handicap service that is purchased at Brookview Golf Course each season.
- Members must be 18 years of age or older by April 1st of the current year

FEES

- BMGA Dues: \$80.00
- Brookview Club Membership: \$93.31 /\$137.22 Resident/Non-Resident
- USGA Handicap Fee: \$38.42
 - Purchased at Brookview Golf Course
 - [Club Member Program | Brookview Golf](#)
- All returned check fees charged to the BMGA will be charged to the member whose check was returned.

These tournaments are designed for all golfers – from scratch to high handicappers -- to have a great time and to participate in a special golf event. In addition to being a lot of fun, prizes are awarded. Each event has its own prize pool and pays out 100% of that prize pool.

One of the advantages of these weekend tournaments is the reserved early morning tee times. This means you will be able to complete your tournament round of golf by early afternoon, leaving you the afternoon for other things. Drinks are also available after each weekend tournament while scores are being tallied and all groups finish.

For assistance in planning your weekend, please review the BMGA Tournament Schedule on the BMGA.ORG website. Tournament Entry forms will be available there. Please download the appropriate entry form and submit before the deadline date for each event.

Payment for tournaments should be paid at time of entry or on the day of the tournament at the latest. Payment can be made via Paypal, Venmo or check/cash dropped in the BMGA lock-box (located in the locker room). If paying cash, please place in an envelope with your name and event being paid.

The entry deadline date is always 4:00 pm two Fridays before the event. This gives Brookview time to sell the tee times that the BMGA will not be using. There is a maximum of 52 players in each event.

All events will use the Member Tees (See APPENDIX at end of document).

Weekend Event Descriptions

The Weekend Events are available to be played. The BMGA Board of Directors will select which tournaments annually are selected.

2 PERSON MATCH PLAY

This event is a handicapped, doubles match play tournament. Also known as Four-Ball. Members can choose their partners, or sign up individually to be paired by the Weekend Director. Each match is 18 holes. If a match is "all

square" after completing 18 holes of play, immediately notify the pro shop and they will do what they can to get you back on the course to begin sudden death match play at your original 1st hole (Tee #1 or #10). For BMGA cup points, a player will be awarded points for how far they make it in the tournament. For example, if a player makes it to round 3 they would receive 30 points for the tournament (plus 50 points for participation), not $30 + 20 + 15 = 65$. When planning the schedules for both the two- person and individual match play events, it is sometimes necessary to schedule byes in the first round of competition. Players who receive a bye will not earn prize money or BMGA points for the first round. Beginning in the second round, they will be eligible for points and prizes as normal. Players winning a match due to forfeit will earn the full amount of points and prizes for the forfeited match.

INDIVIDUAL MATCH PLAY

This event is a handicapped, singles match play tournament. Each match is 18 holes. If a match is "all square" after completing 18 holes of play, immediately notify the pro shop and they will do what they can to get you back on the course to begin sudden death match play at your original 1st hole (Tee #1 or #10). For BMGA cup points, a player will be awarded points for how far they make it in the tournament. For example, if a player makes it to round 3 they would receive 30 points for the tournament (plus 50 points for participation), not $30 + 20 + 15 = 65$. When planning the schedules for both the two- person and individual match play events, it is sometimes necessary to schedule byes in the first round of competition. Players who receive a bye will not earn prize money or BMGA points for the first round. Beginning in the second round, they will be eligible for points and prizes as normal. Players winning a match due to forfeit will earn the full allotment of points and prizes for the forfeited match. Per USGA Appendix C, 100% of players' handicaps will be used.

GREEK SCRAMBLE

Teams are assigned by the Weekend Director based on handicaps to establish as equitable teams as possible. Each player tees-off from the Member Tees of Hole #1. The Team selects the two "best" drives and divides into two 2-man Sub-teams (Sub-team A and Sub-team B). The players whose tee-shots are selected as "best" must remain with their ball. Each 2-man Sub-team completes the hole in scramble format. This sequence is repeated for each of the 18 holes. A minimum of six tee-shots from each player must be used during the round. Scoring example (Hole #1): Sub-team A's score of 3 strokes and Sub-team B's score of 4 strokes. Total Team score for Hole #1 is $3 + 4 = 7$ strokes.

2 PERSON ROTATION (aka ROTATION)

This tournament is a rotation of scramble, fourball, and alternate shot play. This is also known as a combination format. Members can choose their partners, or sign up individually to be paired by the Weekend Director. The course handicap difference of two partners cannot be greater than 11 strokes. **This event has a single net flight.**

Holes #1 — #6: 2 Person Scramble Format

Must use each player's drive at least twice.

"Winter rules" will be allowed within 1 foot of the ball in play, not closer to the hole.

Holes #7 — #12: 2 Person Best Ball Format (a.k.a. Fourball)

The team score is the better gross score of the two players.

There is no minimum number of holes each player needs to score on.

Holes #13 — #18: 1 Person Alternate Shot Format

Player #1's tee shot is used on the odd numbered holes (#13, #15, & #17).

Player #2's tee shot is used on the even numbered holes (#14, #16, & #18).

Each team must identify Player #1 and #2 before the start of hole #13.

On each hole players alternate shots, playing the ball as it lies, until the ball is holed-out.

Players cannot switch balls during the play of a hole unless the ball is lost or damaged.

Per USGA Appendix C the following % of players' handicaps will be used: 2 Person Scramble – 35% low/15% high; 2 Person Best Ball – 85%; Alt Shot – 60% low + 40% high.

2 PERSON BEST BALL (aka FOURBALL)

This tournament is a two-person team event. Members can choose their partners, or sign up individually to be paired by the Weekend Director. Both players will play their own golf balls throughout and the lower net score between the players counts as the team score. This is an 18-hole tournament.

Players must hole out all putts for a score to count. A player may pick up on a hole, but the partner must then finish the hole. If both players on a team fail to hole out on a hole, the team will be disqualified from the tournament. USGA rules shall govern all play. Per USGA recommendation, 85% of handicaps will be used of each player. Max of 11 stroke differential between playing partners. **This event features a single Net flight.** All decisions of the BMGA Rules Committee are final. Per USGA Appendix C, 85% of each players' handicap will be used. Per USGA Appendix C, 85% of players' handicaps will be used.

2 PERSON SCRAMBLE

Scramble Format with two-person teams. Members can choose their partners, or sign up individually to be paired by the Weekend Director. This is an 18-hole tournament. Through the green, "winter rules" will be allowed within 1 foot of the ball in play, not closer to the hole. A ball in a hazard, must be played from within the hazard, unless relief is taken per the applicable USGA rule(s).

There will be a "team handicap" assigned to each team. The team handicap will be based on a formula recommended by the USGA Handicap Department. **This event has a single net flight.** Each player must use at least six (6) drives.

USGA rules shall govern all play. All decisions of the BMGA Rules Committee are final. Per USGA Appendix C, 35% (low)/15% (high) of players' handicaps will be used.

BMGA PRESIDENT'S AND HALL OF FAME CUP / THE STABLEFORD

This tournament will be an 18-hole stroke play Stableford event. **This event has a single net flight.** In addition, there will be a special separate flight within the President's and Hall of Fame Cup event for present and past Presidents of the BMGA, as well as BMGA Hall of Fame members, which will be a net score event. Every player will record their gross score on each hole and the Tournament Committee will adjust the scores for the net events

Scoring is a modified Stableford. Per USGA Appendix C, 95% of players' handicaps will be used. The following point system is used:

- +8 – Double Eagle
- +5 – Eagle
- +3 – Birdie
- +1 – Par
- 0 – Bogey
- 2 – Double Bogey/Worse

PINK BALL

Teams are assigned by the Weekend Director based on handicaps to establish teams as equitable as possible (ABCD – where Player A is the lowest handicap). There are two tournaments happening within the tournament.

Primary Event: Each four-person team will be given a pink ball on the first hole. On each hole, a player will be assigned to the pink ball. The player must play the assigned pink ball. Their net score will be the only score for that hole. The team is eliminated from the pink ball primary event if any of the following happen:

- The ball is hit out of bounds

- The ball is hit into the penalty area and the player must take relief
- The ball is hit into an unplayable situation and the player must take relief
- The ball is lost

The team with the best pink ball, 18 hole net-score, will be declared the winning team.

If a team only has three players, the B or C player will play two balls. One for themselves and one for the missing player. Two or more missing players, the team is disqualified.

The following holes are assigned to each player:

Player A: Hole #1, Hole #5, Hole #9, Hole #13, Hole #17
 Player B: Hole #2, Hole #6, Hole #10, Hole #14, Hole #18
 Player C: Hole #3, Hole #7, Hole #11, Hole #15,
 Player D: Hole #4, Hole #8, Hole #12, Hole #16,

Secondary Event: Three person net best-ball event. Players must hole out all putts for a score to count. A player may pick up on a hole, but all other players must then finish the hole. USGA rules shall govern all play. Per USGA recommendation, 85% of handicaps will be used by each player. The team score will be determined by taking the best three of four net scores. Players in this event cannot earn BMGA Cup Points.

SENIOR CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP *BMGA CUP MAJOR*

The Super Senior tournament will be an 18-hole stroke play, single-flight, handicapped event played on Sunday. Entrants must be 65 years or older to compete. Prizes will be determined based on the number of entrants. If a Super Senior also elects to compete in the Senior tournament, their net score on Saturday will be used for the 2-Day Senior tournament.

The Senior tournament will be a 36-hole stroke play event. Entrants must be 55 years or older to compete. The lowest 2-day gross score will be the Senior Club Champion. Players will be broken up into two flights. A gross and net flight. It is recommended that the gross flight have all players with a plus handicap to 8.9. All players with a 9.0 or higher are placed into the net flight. Any player that elects to play from the Gold tees must be placed in the Net Flight. Sunday's pairings and tee-times will be based on Saturday's results.

Prior to the round on Sunday, a player may elect to move up a flight. For example, a player in the Net flight can elect to move up to the Gross flight. A player may not move down flights once the tournament has begun.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP *BMGA CUP MAJOR*

The tournament will be a 36-hole, stroke play, non-handicapped event (except flight 3 is handicapped) played on Saturday and Sunday. Prior to play on Saturday, the field will be flighted by handicap in ranges. The suggested ranges are:

- Championship Flight: +handicaps to 4.9
- Flight 1: 5.0 to 9.9
- Flight 2: 10.0 to 14.9
- Flight 3 (Net): 15.0+ handicaps
- Any player who elects to play from the Gold Tees must be placed in Flight 3 (Net).

The 3rd flight will be a handicapped net event due to handicap disparity. Sunday's pairings and tee-times will be based on Saturday's results (i.e., Championship Flight/leaders tee-off last). Sunday tee-times will be posted online after play Saturday. You can also call the Pro Shop to find out your tee-time. All players will play from the Member Tees or Gold Tees (if eligible & in a Net Flight) on Saturday and Sunday. The lowest, 2-day gross score playing from

the Member tees will become the Club Champion.

To be eligible as Club Champion, the player must have played in at least three BMGA events prior to the Club Championship or have played in BMGA's WNL. Participation in at least one match with the Brookview traveling teams (8-man senior or 16-man) can be substituted for one of the three events.

Prior to the round on Sunday, a player may elect to move up a flight. For example, a player in 1st flight may elect to move up to the Championship flight. A player may not move down flights. For example, a player in the 1st flight cannot be moved down to the 2nd flight.

USGA rules shall govern all play. Per USGA Appendix C, 95% of players' handicaps will be used for any Net Flights.

CALCUTTA *BMGA CUP MAJOR*

The tournament will be a 27-hole, stroke play, handicapped event. Players compete as 2-man teams. They can either choose their partner or ask to be assigned by the committee. The format is the first 18 holes are a best-ball format (best score of two). The last 9 holes are a both ball format (both scores). The team with the lowest 27-hole total wins. In the event of a tie, a both-ball sudden death will be used.

Note: An auction and horserace betting are conducted outside of the running of this event.

BMGA SHOOTOUT

The season ending tournament is open only to those who qualify. Twenty-four (24) players will qualify for the Shootout; the top 12 in the BMGA Cup standings and the top 12 in the WNL points based on the highest average points (minimum of 10 weeks of play required). If a player qualifies from both WNL and Weekend Event, the better position will be used. There should be 12 players from Weekend and 12 WNL player who qualify. The BMGA board will maintain a published list of those who have qualified. All BMGA members are encouraged to attend and walk along with the players during the Shootout.

This will be a multiple player handicapped event. All 24 players will play the front nine. The top 10 NET scores from the front nine will play a shootout on the back nine to determine the winner. Beginning on Hole 10, the highest net score on each hole will be eliminated until there is only one player standing on the 18th green. If there is a tie for the high score, those tied will compete in a chip-off. The farthest from the hole from the designated chip-off location will be eliminated. USGA rules shall govern all play. The payout of the BMGA Shootout is:

- 1st Place - \$250
- 2nd Place - \$200
- 3rd Place - \$150
- 4th Place - \$100
- 5th Place - \$50

TIES

Weekend tournaments typically end in ties for any number of places or flights, and in the event of a tie, ties will stand. For BMGA points and payouts, the values will be split between the players/teams evenly. For example, if a tie occurs for 1st place in the Greek Scramble, both teams would receive $88 \text{ BMGA Cup points } (100 + 75) / 2$, and the same would occur for prize payouts.

There are three exceptions to this rule, meaning that Individual Match Play, 2 Person Match play, Club Championship (including Senior and Super Senior) and Calcutta may not end in a tie. For the Individual and 2 Person Match play events, if a match is "all square" after completing 18 holes of play, players should immediately notify the Brookview Pro Shop and they will do what they can to get you back on the course to begin sudden death match play at your

original 1st hole (Tee #1 or #10). No match play events will end in a tie. For the Club Championship, ties for 1st place in all flights will be played off in a sudden death playoff starting from hole #1. If there is a tie after the first playoff hole, the sudden death playoff continues to hole #2 and so on until an outright winner is declared. There will be no playoffs for second place or below for the Club Championship.

BMGA CUP

The BMGA Cup will be like the PGA Tour’s FedEx Cup. It will be given to the overall point leader with the points being determined by the schedule listed below. Points will be given for participating in the weekend events as well as additional points for placing in those tournaments. The winner of the BMGA Cup will receive a trophy as well as a \$250 gift card to the Brookview Pro Shop. The point standings for the BMGA Cup will be tallied and posted on the BMGA website after each weekend tournament is concluded. The BMGA Cup will be award to the overall point champion at the year-end banquet.

*Those eligible to play in the Club Championship and the Senior or Super Senior Club Championship will be entitled only to the points from the tournament with the highest point total achieved from the 3 (both participation and place). For example, a BMGA member playing both the Club Championship and the Senior Club Championship who earns 100 and 130 points respectively would only receive the 130 points toward their BMGA cup total.

**Points in the Individual and 2 Person Match Play are based on how many wins you accomplish. A bye does not count as a win. For example, those who make it to the semi-final round and lost would receive 40 additional points.

Weekend Events that are net events are dictated by USGA rules with regards to the maximum number of strokes and the handicap allowed. See USGA [appendix C](#) for full details but the below is current guidance:

- Individual Stroke Play Events (95%)
- 2 Person Match Play (90%)
- Individual Match Play (100%)
- Stableford (95%)
- 2 Person Best Ball (aka Four-Ball) (85%)
- Pink Ball (85%)
- 2 Person Scramble (35% low/15% high)
- Greensomes aka Alternate Shot (60% low handicap + 40% high handicap)

Tournament Payouts

Tournaments that feature both a gross and net flight, the money allocated for each flight should be proportional to

those who registered for the tournament. For example, the Weekend Coordinator will determine the breakdown of players and allocate the funds based on those registered. A common scenario might be where Net Flight pays out top 6 and Gross Flight pays out top 4.

Code of Conduct

The BMGA Code of Conduct applies to all BMGA members including Wednesday Night League (WNL) members and Weekend Only members. Members may be warned, suspended, expelled or have their BMGA Membership terminated for violations of the Code of Conduct. In addition, the BMGA may reject a membership application, revoke an accepted application, expel from the WNL and/or suspend a player from future tournaments if the player engage in conduct detrimental to the integrity and image of the game of golf and/or the BMGA.

On the course:

1. All BMGA Members must:
 - a) Adhere to the [local rules](#) of the BMGA and/or Brookview.
 - b) Refrain from excessive use of profanity.
 - c) Not damage the golf course, other player's equipment, etc.
 - d) Avoid slow play, apply "Ready Golf" principles and allow other golfers to play through as appropriate, waving the following group through when searching for lost balls and maintaining the speed of play by keeping up with the group in front.
 - e) Participate in WNL as scheduled and attend Weekend events when registered.
 - f) Follow established golf etiquette respecting the course, such as:
 - I. Repair of pitch marks, replace divots, rake bunkers, etc.
 - II. Show the necessary respect to fellow golfers at all times, which incorporates; no shouting on the course, no misuse of equipment (i.e. throwing clubs in frustration etc.), no aggressive behavior, or the taking of performance enhancing and/or illegal drugs.
 - III. Conduct oneself in a sportsmanlike and honest manner
 - IV. Switch off (or set to silent mode) all mobile phones during play on the golf course
